### FAQs about Google Classroom and our Whyteleafe Virtual School.

# How will I know what will be planned?

Your year group teachers will send out a weekly plan at the start of each week. This will show what assignments and activities will be sent out on each day of that week. This will vary according to the age of the children and will enable you to plan the children's virtual school learning around other activities and commitments.

## How do we access Google Classroom?

The reminder of how to access Google Classroom is in the link below. This can be done via a laptop/ chrome book etc, tablet, or by downloading a free mobile phone app:

## How will virtual learning work be set/ marked?

- 1. Classwork assignments will be set by teachers.
- 2. On the assignment, the teachers will respond, where possible, with the correct answers, and / or class feedback.
- 3. The staff will not be able to respond to every piece of every child's work individually.

# Can the children use Google Classroom to chat to their friends?

Remember, Google Classroom is a virtual school environment, **not** a social networking environment. Any comments should be about learning and remain as respectful as if we were at school.

#### Is it safe?

Some links may be set up to visit youtube or another website. We would advise children to only complete these activities with an adult present to ensure e-safety rules are followed.

#### Do the children have to do the work?

As part of the Home-School agreement (pictured), daily reading, maths fluency and other home learning is expected. The children are also expected to complete the work to the best of their ability.

#### What if my child gets stuck?

Please do not do the work for them. Encourage them to do their best and share any concerns or difficulties that were experienced with the assignment when it is submitted to us. The teachers will be able to read this and adapt future work or respond as appropriate. If you could not access a piece of work, you can always complete an alternative similar activity, just put a note through the same assignment submit method.
