Education and Care

- ▶ Early Years Foundation Stage
 - ▶ Forest School
 - ▶ Use of other parts of the school
 - ▶ Snack bar
 - ▶ Lunch in nursery
 - ▶ Outside Area

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Nursery Sessions available

- ▶ 5 days funded by extended funded early education (30 hr eligibility code)
- ▶ 2.5 days a week funded by funded early education (15 hrs) and option for 2.5 days a week funded by parent or carer
- ▶ 2.5 days a week funded by funded early education for two year olds (FEET) and option for 2.5 days a week funded by parent or carer.
- ▶ 5 days a week funded by parent or carer (2 year old)

For timings see application form

- ▶ Parents wishing to apply for a place for entry in **September 2020** must complete the application form and submit it directly to the nursery (via the school office) **by noon Wednesday 25th March**.
- ▶ Subject to availability we will also have a late application date for January 2020 followed by a Summer and Spring admission date.

FREE EARLY EDUCATION FOR TWO YEAR OLDS (FEET)

You can apply for FEET the term your child turns two but you will not receive the funded hours until the following term:

15 HOURS FUNDED EARLY EDUCATION FOR 3 AND 4 YEAR OLDS

All 3 and 4 year old children are eligible for 15 hours of funded early education for 38 weeks of the year from the term after they turn 3.

- ▶ 1 September 2019 – for children born between 1 April and 31 August 2016
- ▶ 1 January 2020 – for children born between 1 September to 31 December 2016
- ▶ 1 April 2020 – for children born between 1 January to 31 March 2017.

30 Hours Funded Childcare

In September 2017 the government introduced an extended entitlement of an additional 15 hours

This will be made available to families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family) and each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum wage (NMW) or National Living wage (NLW), and less than £100,000 per year.

Apply for the code via Government Childcare Portal

If you would like to increase your child's attendance from 15 to 30 hours and are not eligible for funding, there is the option to self-fund.

Lunch Time

- ▶ School lunches are available cooked by the school kitchen and are charged at currently £2.20 per day. Alternatively, your child may bring in a healthy packed lunch.
- ▶ For children attending 15 hours a week, there may be an option to add on an extra $\frac{1}{2}$ day on Wednesdays. This would be subject to availability and would be payable at £17.50 per session for 3 and 4 year olds and £21.00 per session for 2 year olds. You can use 30 hour funding code instead

Nursery Uniform

- White polo shirt, grey skirt, shorts, culottes, pinafore dress or uniform trousers.
- Black uniform sweatshirt.- purchased through Marks and Spencer
- Black shoes suitable for inside and outside activities
- White, black socks, black or grey tights.
- In summer, yellow checked or striped dresses maybe worn.
- Wellington boots
- Waterproof outside clothes (all in ones, trousers and coat) Spare change of clothes in bags on pegs
