Good morning Year 4!

We are going to start learning about the myth Romulus and Remus. This week we're going to focus on pages 1-6 in the ebook.

Read the pages again to remind yourself of the story and then have a go at the vocabulary sheet where you're looking for fronted adverbials.

Adverbials tell you when, where or how something happened. When they are used at the start of sentences, they are called fronted adverbials. Examples of fronted adverbials include all of a sudden and in the meantime. Connecting words such as however are also fronted adverbials when they are at the start of a sentence.
